KNOW THE RULES OF THE COTSWOLDS HOA

Have you checked out the HOA's covenants, By-Laws and ARC Rules lately? If not, now's a great time to brush up on the do's and don'ts of the community.

For those of you who are unaware, ARC Rules play a crucial role in keeping the association running smoothly. ARC Rules are legally binding rules and regulations that each homeowner agreed to when he or she purchased a property within the association. If owners rent out their homes, it is the owner's responsibility to inform the new residents of the Association ARC Rules and By-Laws. The By-Laws and ARC Rules include stipulations on assessments, building design and additions, and the governance of the association. All residents should understand these By-Laws and ARC Rules so they don't unintentionally violate them; owners can be fined, have liens on their homes, and can be sued for violating the ARC Rules.

The ARC Rules are intended to help ensure that the neighborhood can thrive and that members are treated fairly and equally. So don't be left in the dark—check out the association's ARC Rules today!

SPRINGTIME PROJECTS

Painting, Fences and other Projects

Please remember that exterior projects, such as having a new roof installed, painting your home, including the front door (but not including minor touching up), replacing a fence, replacing a tree, installing new planter beds or borders, and similar projects require that an Archi-

tectural Change Request be submitted before work begins.

The process is very simple. Go to our website at http://thecotswoldshoa.com/arc-requests-guidelines.html. On the bottom of that page, you will find the ARC Request Form to complete. In most cases the Change Request is processed in less than 72 hours.

SPRINKLER SYSTEMS

The sprinkler systems installed when your home was built are probably between 3-9 years old. Now is a good time to call a professional to have your sprinklers *tuned up*. Casual observation would indicate sprinkler heads pointing in the wrong direction or partially blocked by grass or shrubs.

NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME WATCH

Know Your Neighbors & Report Suspicious Activity

The basic idea is for neighbors to watch out for each other. By looking after a neighbors property as if it were your own, you will more likely contact the Sheriff's Department if you observe something suspicious. Citizens act as extra "eyes and ears" for the Sheriff's Department, so that calls to the police will be made when criminal activity is suspected. An alert, cooperative neighborhood is the greatest single defense against crime. By getting to know your neighbors and their vehicles, you will most likely be alert to suspicious people, vehicles, and/or sounds that could indicate criminal activity.

Officers send bulletins to Crime Watch Areas on an as-needed basis. This information is sent regarding crimes of a serious nature, or when a suspect's description is available. This information, coupled with the two basic principles of Crime Watch, can help citizens become a part of reducing the overall crime rate in their neighborhoods.

MUST-DO HOME MAINTENANCE

The quickest fix is to not have the problem in the first place. Here's a checklist of items every homeowner should get to regularly:

- 1. Test your garage door opener monthly to ensure that it reverses when it hits an obstruction or when its sensor beam is interrupted.
- 2. Vacuum the clothes dryer's exhaust duct at least once a year. If the duct is plastic, replace it (it's a fire hazard). Rigid sheet-metal ducting is best.
- 3. Replace furnace filters quarterly, or as recommended by the furnace manufacturer.
- 4. Test all GFCI (ground fault circuit interrupter) outlets monthly. Press the test button and use a voltage tester to make sure the power goes off.
- 5. Clean leaves and debris from the condenser of a central air conditioner seasonally.
- 6. Once a year, vacuum the refrigerator coils underneath the appliance.
- 7. Have the fireplace chimney inspected and cleaned annually.
- 8. Inspect window and door caulking and weather stripping yearly.

RECIPE FOR CRISPY CHEESE WAFERS

Preheat oven to 350°. Beat 4 cups freshly grated sharp Cheddar cheese; 2 cups all-purpose flour; 1 cup butter softened; 1 Tab kosher salt; $\frac{1}{4}$ teas. ground red pepper at medium speed with electric mixer 30-60 seconds or until mixture forms a ball. Gently stir in 2 cups Rice Krispies® cereal.

Shape into 1 inch balls and place 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets. Flatten each dough ball with a fork dipper in flour. Bake in batches 25-28 minutes or until golden brown. Transfer wafers to wire racks and cool complete. Makes 6 dozen. Serve warm or room temp.

Blue Mesa Guacamole (great Dallas, TX restaurant)

2 medium ripe avocados, seeded

1½ ounces red salsa

1 tsp. serrano pepper, seeded and minced

½ small red onion, diced

1 small tomato, diced

1 TB. cilantro, chopped fine

1 wedge fresh lime

1/4 tsp. kosher salt

dash of white pepper

dash of granulated garlic


pinch of crushed dried oregano

Score avocado pulp while in shell and scoop pulp into bowl. Using two forks, mash the pulp into chunky consistency. Add remaining ingredients (increase amount of serrano pepper for a spicier guacamole) and mix until fully incorporated.

Transfer guacamole to a serving bowl and serve with yellow and blue corn tortilla chips. Makes about 2 cups.
